on the level of cleanliness she met in the school on her visit. She also organized the Women of Enugu Diocese, who visited the students,

during the last year's Mothers' Day Celebration.

Also, women from Emmanuel Anglican Church, Achara Layout, Enugu, and Nara Archdeaconries of the Diocese

visited the school with bags of garri, gallons of palm oil, and coolers of cooked rice on 8th March, 2024, in preparation for the forthcoming Mothering Sunday,

while the women from All Saints Church, G.R.A, Enugu, visited on the proper day of the Mothering Sunday; 10th March, 2024.

The students enjoyed the visits and we appreciated "Mama Nike" and the Women for the visits, and above all, we thank God Almighty who made it to be so.

RENOVATION WORKS

Upon assumption of office, the new Proprietress, Dr. Mrs. Ruby Ike (Mama Enugu), swung into action by renovating/repairing some of the properties in the school,

which were in bad shape, in the Administrative block, the Hostel, the Kitchen areas, the ICT laboratory etc.

We also brought joy to the hearts of the workers by increasing their salaries, which had been stagnant for over ten (10) years.

I pray that God will strengthen and encourage her for the work of revival required in the school.

We are having a major challenge in the area of our students' population, which we are trusting God for His timely intervention to bring us more students in Jesus' name, Amen.

The students need Volleyball, Basketball, and Badminton courts in the school, as these facilities will help to develop them in their skills.

COMPUTER SYSTEMS

The school still needs more computer-sets that will be enough with the number of students in a class and during lessons.

Students are already practising sewing as part of their skill acquisition with the two sewing machines donated to the school,

by the retired Archbishop, The Most Rev. Dr. E. O. Chukwuma (OON). We appeal for donations for more machines.

STATE OF THE NATION

(NIGERIA)

On May 29th 2025, Nigeria's democracy, since the start of the 4th Republic, turned one score and 6 years!

Nevertheless, some Nigerians have recently argued that,

there has been, if any, minimal gain of democracy in Nigeria.

While the argument as to the correctness or wrongness of fuel subsidy removal,

and floating of the Naira seem to have reduced, the President should be reminded of the dangers of breaking a coconut on a man's head, in order to

feed him with a piece of the same coconut, especially after a record borrowing of \$6.45 billion (about 10.1 Trillion Naira) between May 2023 and September 2024.

It is necessary to remind the President that time is speeding away, and carrying with it, the hope he promise renew.

The resurgence of insecurity, worsening food crises,

and standard of living of most Nigerians, as well as accusations of nepotism (as was prevalent in the Buhari administration), continues to dominate national discourse.

The President has however, made sweeping promises, assuring Nigerians in his 2025 New Year message, that their sacrifices, "will not be in vain even in the months ahead."

Whether those words can be taken to the bank is another matter entirely.

In the interim, Nigerians continue to yearn for electoral reforms, improved security and the total overhaul of the 1999 constitution, as possible legacies the government can leave.

EDUCATION & YOUTH RESTIVENESS:

The President deserves commendation on his Student Loan Scheme, which according to the Presidency, has seen 600,000 students receive over 104billion Naira.

This is a welcomed development, especially if it is able to continuously target the indigent students, for whom it was meant. However, we must not forget,

that a staggering 10.2 million children of primary school age and 8.1 million children of secondary school age are still out of school and are a time bomb waiting to explode.

To detonate this bomb, every state government must ensure that a reasonable percentage of its budget is channeled to education without diversion into private pockets,

or the belly of snakes as was reported in 2018.

The government should prioritize the needs of the youths, who for the most part, are demanding for good governance. Their voices should be heard and government has to engage in continuous dialogue with them, since any attempt at stifling their voices will only lead to a less desirable result,

as with the recent, youth-led 30-Day-Rant-Challenge.

In addition, every effort should be made to reduce the number of unemployed youths as this will aid in reducing restiveness.

The losses of the 2020 "#End SARS" protest are still fresh in the minds of Nigerians.

STATE OF THE NATION

(ENUGU STATE)

We commend the unparalleled effort of the Enugu State government in the areas of infrastructural development, security, and education!

With the signing of the N971 billion 2025 budget into law, out of which capital expenditure represents 86%, and education receiving 33%,

Governor Peter Mbah has demonstrated his intention to revolutionize the entire landscape of Enugu State. The bill to amend the 2004 Landlord and Tenant Law,

The bill to amend the 2004 Landlord and Tenant Law, in the House of Assembly has also not gone unnoticed. As this, when signed into law,

will help alleviate the burden on tenants who struggle with excessive charges, such as, legal fees, agency fees, caution fees and caretaker's commission.

Earlier in the year, President **Bola Tinubu was here to** inaugurate key projects within the state, including 30 "Smart Green Schools",

rural road rehabilitations, urban road renewals, and the deployment of 150 patrol vehicles, equipped with advanced Al-embedded surveillance technology.

Unfortunately, despite these strides, there has been recurring reports of killings in Uzo-Uwani (LGA), Enugu State, as insurgents, reportedly herdsmen,

have unleashed attacks on the agrarian communities. This is, therefore, imploring the governor, to make greater effort,

in securing the length and breadth of Enugu State, and leave a legacy of SECURED ENUGU STATE!

THEME WE ARE ON THE THRESHOLD OF REVIVAL [PSALM 85:6]

By the great mercy of God, through the Holy Spirit, we have been running with this theme in the Diocese. We shall explore this theme in Eight (8) segments. They are:

- 1. BRIEF BACKGROUND OF THE THEME.
- 2. WHAT IS REVIVAL AND DEFINITION?
- 3. WHAT IS NOT NECESSARILY REVIVAL?

- 4. WHEN SHOULD REVIVAL BE DESIRED?
- 5. CONDITIONS TO MEET FOR US TO HAVE REVIVAL.
- 6. WAVES OF REVIVAL IN HISTORY AND IN OUR GENERATION.

- 7. WE CAN HAVE REVIVALS.
- 8. IMPLICATION OF THE THEME FOR OUR WOMEN AND THE DIOCESE.

BRIEF BACKGROUND OF THE THEME.

After a period of sin and repentance, the author of Psalm 85 asks the Lord to show mercy to his people. He asked God to turn away His anger from the nation,

and restore their land. He longed for God's salvation and to see faithfulness springing up from the ground and righteousness filling the sky.

The Northern kingdom of Israel was taken into Assyrian captivity in 722/21 BC, and the Southern kingdom in 586 BC.

A remnant of all 12 Tribes of Israel returned to the promised land when Cyrus of Persia allowed the initial group of captives to return in 586 BC.

Because of their apostasy, Israel had been taken away into captivity. Because of their repentance while in bondage, they were allowed to return.

The Psalm had turned to prayer when the initial captives returned, they were met with opposition. The opposition was so much,

that they ceased rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem. However, through the grace of God, they were allowed to return (Ezra Chapter 4:1-end). The general opinion is that this Psalm 85 was written after the return of the Jews out of their captivity in Babylon,

when they still remained, under some measure of God's displeasure, which they here pray for the removal of.

The "Church" here was in a deluge, above were clouds, before were waves, everything was dark and dismal.

The Psalmist closed with hope that God will answer the petition to deliver them from the trouble they were experiencing in the rebuilding.

The condition for receiving God's blessing was that they turn not again to the folly of going after other gods (Psalm 85:6).

When God's mercy and truth unite for the benefit of man, and man lives in righteousness and peace, the result is the restoration of joy among the people of God.

God's purpose for revival is multi-faceted, encompassing spiritual renewal, repentance, and a deeper walk with Him;

ultimately leading to a transformation of individual and society, impacting the world with the message of God's grace.

The petitions are against sin and wrath (vs. 4) and for mercy and grace (vs. 7). The pleas are from former favours (vs. 1-3) and present distresses (vs. 5, 6).

In this Psalm, we can find assistance / urgency in our prayers to God, both for His Church in general, our Diocese in particular, and for our land Nigeria as a whole.

The church here, in affliction and distress by God's direction, is making her supplications to God. The people of God, in a very low,

beggarly and weak condition are here taught how to address themselves to God. So ready is God to hear and answer the prayers of His people, that by His Spirit, in the word, and in the heart, He incites their petitions and puts words in their mouths.

For Revival to happen again, God's people are to pray for the forgiveness of the iniquity, confessing same (vs. 2),

for the taking away of righteous anger and wrath (vs. 3), and to "Turn us, O God of our salvation, and cause Thine anger towards us to cease" (vs. 4).

They are to pray for the manifestation of God's good will to them; "Show us Thy mercy O Lord, and grant us Thy Salvation" (vs. 7).

For Revival to breakout, God's people are to eagerly and relentlessly express their desire, "Wilt Thou not revive us again, that Thy people may rejoice in Thee?" (vs. 6).

God had granted the children of Israel some reviving in their bondage, in captivity (Ezra 9:8).

Their return out of Babylon,

was as life from dead (Ezekiel 37:11).

"Revive, therefore, Thy work in the midst of the years" (Habakkuk 3:2).

From vs. 8 -13 we are assured that the Lord will speak peace to His people (vs. 8); His salvation, help, deliverance, answer, is near them, that fear Him (vs. 9); mercy and truth will meet together in our time, while righteousness and peace become inseparable (vs. 10);

truth shall spring from the earth – all of us, while righteousness from God will look down and beckon from heaven, as well as go before, and set us in the way of God's steps, delight, walk and living (11, 13). "Yea, the Lord shall give in return that which is good ...

that the glory of the Lord may dwell in our lives, church, Diocese, and land" (12, 9).

WHAT IS REVIVAL?
AND DEFINITIONS.

Revival is a time, season, period of fresh visitation of God on a person/individual, people/group, church, community or nation,

with the outpouring of His Spirit, and attendant manifestations of His presence, power and glory.

This is born out of genuine earnestness and sincerity of worship, prayer and hunger for God – for more of Him, His righteousness and resultant holy living.

It is marked with conversion of souls (in turning to the Lord in repentance); demonstration of signs and wonders -

with healing of individuals, relationships – one to one – in families and with others, as well as the community, and in the nation.

It also boils over to over flow of love, joy, peace, economic prosperity, progress and godliness.

a) In the healing of communities is the case of Almolonga, a 19,000 populated community in Guatemala, in the 1970s to 2000s.

In the suburb, where there were over 30 club houses before; with the wave of revival sweeping through, all the clubs closed.

More than 30 churches sprang up and 4 jails in the community closed. The police had no jobs as they no more carried guns,

only whistles, to control traffic. The crops grew stupendously and there was palpable joy, humility and peace all over the town.

b) The Welsh Revival of 1904 served as a good replica of revival across the nation. In the Welsh Revival, "suddenly like an unexpected tornado",

the Spirit of God swept over the land.

The churches were crowded so that multitudes were unable to get in.

Meeting lasted from 10am in the morning until 12 midnight. Three different services were held each day. Confessions of awful, hideous sins,

were heard on every side. Those who selfishly wasted their money on alcohol suddenly became a great joy and support to their families.

Bars and movie houses closed. The theatre had to leave for want of patronage. Former prostitutes started holding bible studies,

mules in the coal mines refused to work, being unused to kindness. In 5 weeks - 20,000 people joined the churches.

c) Quoting David Dickson (1583 - 1662), in the impact of Revival on the society. "Revival is a special outpouring of God's blessings, when His people,

are spiritually renewed and many others are converted." Thus the fire of revival spreads beyond its point of origin, impacting the environment, others, and the society at large. d) According to 1 Kings 18 vs 18 - 19, 30 - 40,Revival is a period of turning from sin, with repentance from dead idols,

and repairing of the altar of wholehearted worship to the Lord.

It is a season of relentless prayers, that results in a great rain of God's intervention.

The heavens gave rain and the earth brought forth her fruit (1 Kings 18:45). The showers came and everything started growing again.

DEFINITION OF TERMS:

- To revive, simply means to -
- Raise up to life, (Hosea 6:2, 11, 12), (Habakkuk 3:2)
- Restore, raise to life, live again

- Raise, resurrect, resuscitate from dying to what ought to be.
- Quicken a spiritual awakening, raising to truly live in God's sight daily, habitually,

our true potentials as Christians, demonstrating His mercies, goodness and power.

3 WHAT IS NOT NECESSARILY REVIVAL?

Revival is not necessarily: a) Special programmes organized by Church, tagged as Revival services or Revival Weekend - it may include, but goes beyond these.

Revival is not necessarily: b) Crusades with banners characterized by loud and expressive expressions of faith, such as shouting, singing, and testifying.

Revival is not necessarily: c) Brought about mechanically just by man's methodical plan: It is not about the latest church growth plan or book.

It is not a great marketing strategy or advertising gimmick developed by the church.

Neither about the systematically packaged programmes products organized to be maximally flawless.

d) Not powerful worship music rented, commercialized gospel singer.

e) About profound and great sermons (the Welsh Revival of 1904 had very little of sermon preaching).

f) Miraculous wonders (many of which, in our times, may be faked).

g) Even about having large congregations, who are no different in character from the market throng.

WHEN IS REVIVAL NEEDED?

We need/should desire Revival: a) When complacency, lethargy and lukewarmness set in our personal lives and walk with God, and in the body of Christ / the Church.

We need/should desire Revival:

b) When we are growing more to love the world and the pleasures of the world.

We need/should desire Revival:

c) When we seem to become contented with just where we are, who we are, with no burning desire,

to be "transformed into the same image of the Lord from glory to glory as by the Spirit of the Lord" (2 Corinthians 3:18).

Nor do we seek and hunger to "grow in grace and knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18).

Neither do we yearn anymore like Paul, "that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection" (Philippians 3:10),

not to talk of "growing in measure to more of His stature of the fullness of Christ" (Christlikeness) (Ephesians 4:13)

We need/should desire Revival:

d) When we are going to do real battle with sin in our lives and when our land is going to be healed.

We need/should desire Revival: e) When we seem to become careless with God in our words, attitude, lifestyle, worship and in His awesome holiness and standard.

- We need/should desire Revival:
- f) When we as a Church have so many programmes and activities/groups to belong to, yet with little or minimal spiritual and societal impact.

We like Baal prophets, seemingly make so much "noise" (1 Kings 18:26 – 29).

We need/should desire Revival: g) When immorality, loose and debased perverted lifestyles and sin run rampant and become the order of the day,

same sex relationships are permissible now and the LGBTQ community is gaining attention and patronage; the Revisionist agenda is rife,

and breathing well; the new normal of nudity/bare-it-all has dominated the fashion world and is thriving in the churches.

We need/should desire Revival: h) When sex scandals involving, but not limited to men of God, are everyday news now. Members of the church,

public and private servants, university lecturers, our higher institutions, have all become more lecherous.

Prostitution, incest, and adultery are now legalized overtly and covertly in many nations as means of transaction in public and private organizations.

We need/should desire Revival: i) When the word of God its reading, study, and meditation become lukewarm, ritualistic, as if just reading a textbook.

We need/should desire Revival: When we become increasingly earthly, worldly minded, and conforming, seeking to be accepted by the society,

and we depict carnality in all aspects of our living, rather than being heavenly focused, spirit-guided, and directed,

and the Spirit and presence of God seems increasingly afar even up to various churches.

We need/should desire Revival:

k) When passion for soul winning wanes and missionary efforts grow feeble, far and in between.

We need/should desire Revival:

I) Finally, when hardship and suffering of any and every nature become the order of the day in any life, group, church, society or nation, and intense persecution hits the church and the believers as currently in Nigeria.

4 WHEN DOES REVIVAL COME?

Revival is a sovereign act of God that wakens people from spiritual slumber, calling them to repentance, faith and renewed obedience.

Revival addresses and counters spiritual decline, bringing people back to closer relationship with God with intense desire and hunger in prayers, and transparent holy living.

The two kinds or means to promote, desire to experience revival, according to Charles Finney, are the one to influence men and the other to influence God.

a) Prayer to move God not that God's mind is changed by prayer or that His disposition or character is changed,

but prayer produces such a change in us as renders it consistent for God to intervene.

- b) By God's visitation in the outpour of the Spirit.
 - > Revival comes about when there is an intense longing, and a readiness to pay the price,

and meet the conditions for it; with a readiness to submit to the Holy Spirit dealings and directives fully.

> The hallmark of every revival is the breaking down of the heart before God, with deep humility and a forsaking of sin.

The hearts longing to experience God's presence; and the hearts cry to worship in spirit and in truth.



> Roberts Liardon, the author of God's Generals, deposes that from many stories of revivals, personal revivals usually led to church and national revivals.

It usually begins with a complete trust in the Lord, a profound reverence for God, and a determination to overcome the social ills each revivalists saw in his generation.

These revivalists transformed lives in such a way that led to the transformation of communities and nations.

5

CONDITIONS TO MEET FOR US TO HAVE REVIVAL.

The 3Rs of REVIVAL:

Revival comes, blossoms, bursts out when the 3Rs of Revival have been met.

1. Repentance from every known sin, compromise, habit, weight and action that turns away God's presence, and keeps us from turning wholly to the Lord, in holiness, is a veritable herald of revival.

Psalm 66:18 – "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me".

Psalm 139:23-24 – "Search me, Oh God and know my heart; try me, and know my thought. And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (KJV).

This is about Repentance without reservation – owning up to our sins – overt and covert – with sincere confession of every secret sin, wrong dealings, hypocritical worship, and sycophancy. It is about unfeigned, unpretentious and whole hearted turning to the Lord.

2. Renewed obedience to the word of God: Deliberate creation of the opportunity and time for and the reverence to the word of God,

reading intentionally, meditatively and expectantly, is a precursor to revival.

Ezra 7:10 — "For Ezra had devoted himself to the study and observance of the law of the Lord, and to teaching its decrees and laws in Israel". (NIV)

Isaiah 66:2^b – "But on this one will I look: On him who is poor and of a contrite spirit, and who trembles at my word". (NKJV)

Isaiah 57:15 — "For this is what the high and lofty One says, He who lives forever, whose name is holy: I live in a high and lofty place,

but also with him who is contrite and lowly in spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly and to revive the heart of the contrite".

Acts 6:7 – "And the word of God increased; and the number of disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly; and a great company of priests were obedient to the faith." (KJV)

Acts 12:24 – "But the word of God grew and multiplied." When in constant heart attitude of seeking God, asking Him to reveal sin,

and choosing to put ourselves and attitude completely under the influence of God's word.

For change, when, we, in humility, repent and declare our dependency on God humbled, guided, contrite, broken, ready to be set aright - in the light of the word of God – in Renewed obedience to God's word, God cannot Resist. He will look, see: we will attract His presence and intervention in Revival!

3. The 3rd R is Relentless, Intense, Earnest Heartfelt prayers. This is deep, burdened intercession,

with a deep realization that only the Spirit of God can do it. It is about agonizing in prayers and not organization of man.

Herein is the manner of praying, as in our text. Here is captured the Expectant **Believing Unrelenting** Intercessory Prayer of faith of Daniel in Daniel 9:1-6, 17-22.

The effectual fervent prayers of faith of right man – as in James 5:16-18, will surely avail much.

Here is engaging in Relentless Prayer that ushers in the sound of abundance of rain great rain and showers of revival (1 Kings 18:42-44).

WE CAN HAVE REVIVALS.

Having seen God's interventions through ages and eras in response to the burning desire of His children,

it is clear that we can have the same wave of revivals in our time, family, church, community and nation, if only we are similarly hungry, and thirst for the outpouring of God's Spirit again in relentless prayers, born out of renewed obedience to the word of God and transparent holy living.

We yearn for a re-enactment of the 1st Century (Acts of the Apostles) Christianity, clothed with the life of godliness and consequent presence, power and glory of God.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE THEME FOR OUR WOMEN AND THE DIOCESE

Revival has profound implications for individuals and families. It can lead to personal transformation, increased spiritual awareness, and strengthened family bonds. 1.) Individual

Implications a. Personal Transformation: Revival often involves a profound change of heart, leading individuals to seek God with a renewed passion,

1.) Individual

Implications and to make positive changes in their lives.

b. Spiritual Awareness:
 People may experience a heightened sense of sin,

1.) Individual Implications

and their need for God's grace, leading to repentance and a desire for a closer relationship with Him.

c. Joy and Fulfillment: Revival can bring greater joy and fulfillment in one's personal life and work, as individuals find their purpose in serving God and others.

d. Increased Compassion and Outreach: A deeper understanding of one's own sinfulness can lead to a greater awareness of the needs of others and a desire to share the gospel.

- 2.) Family Implications
- a. Strengthened Bonds: Revival can strengthen family relationship as individuals are led to seek God together and to live according to His word

b. Positive changes in Family Life: Families may experience positive changes as individuals are transformed, and learn to prioritize their relationships with God and each other.

c. Discipline and Guidance: Families can model biblical principles and provide loving guidance to their children, helping them develop a strong faith.

d. Addressing Conflict and Healing: Revival can provide an opportunity for families to address past hurts, reconcile differences and experience healing and restoration.

e. Passage of Faith: Revival can play a crucial role in transmitting faith and values to future generations, ensuring that the love of God is passed down through the family.

3.) Implications for the Church

Revival in the Church implies a significant spiritual awakening that can lead to increased spiritual life,

renewed commitment to Christ, and a deeper understanding of God's Word. It often involves a renewed sense of God's presence,

leading to more effective witnessing and outreach to the world. Revival equally draws us back to a close, intimate relationship with the Lord.

Revival involves a heartfelt return to God, and His Commandments, fostering a sense of repentance and renewed dedication to His work.

It also strengthens the church's mission, by inspiring individuals to share their faith and impact their communities.

4.) Implications for the Community:

A spiritual revival in Almolonga, a town in Guatemala, led to profound social and economic transformation, as it has historically done.

The transformation was attributed to increased faith and devotion, impacting various aspects of the community, including agricultural, health,

social, spiritual, and relationships. This started from 1974 – 1975 when the Pastor God used to begin the revival move, Pastor Moriano Riscajche, The community once known for idolatry, drunkness, poverty, and spouse abuse, became known for prosperity and blessings at the hand of God.

Where there were once more than 30 bars, there are now over 30 churches. Almolonga is now known as the "Valley of Miracles,"

and the people now ship vegetables of amazing size and quality all around the world.

5.) Implications for the Nation:

Revival within a nation can have far reaching implications, potentially leading to positive societal change, including increased unity,

a renewed sense of purpose, and spiritual transformation. The above implications aligned with the scriptures in 2 Chronicles 7:14 "If my people,

who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land".

It can also address issues like decline in morality, apathy and spiritual stagnation.

Spiritual Renewal: Revival often involves individuals experiencing a profound change in their relationship with God, leading to increased faith, prayer, and devotion.

Increased Morality and Ethical Behaviour:

As people turn to God, there can be a decrease in sinful habits and an increase in ethical behaviour, potentially, leading to a more just and equitable society.

Social Unity:

Revival can foster a sense of unity among believers and even non-believers,

as they work together to address common problems and promote positive change in their communities.

Economic Growth: Revival can also have a positive impact on the economy as people become more focused on hard work,

ethical business practices, and investing in their communities.

Revival can provide individuals with a renewed

with a renewed sense of purpose and hope, motivating them to make a positive impact on the world around them.
